



THEME PARK FOOD AND MERCHANDISE CARTS, KIOSKS AND MOBILE FOOD DISPENSING VEHICLES REQUIREMENTS

DEFINITIONS

- A mobile food dispensing vehicle is defined as a vehicle mounted public food service establishment, self-propelled or otherwise movable from place to place. Such vehicles must be self-sufficient for utilities. Each mobile food dispensing vehicle is required to have a State approved commissary that it reports to at least once a week.
- A cart is defined as easily movable by no more than two persons and requires no disassembly to be performed prior to transport or storage.
- A portable structure is defined as movable by more than two persons or with equipment and may require some disassembly to be performed prior to transport or storage.
- A kiosk is defined as a small structure, no larger than 300 square feet which may be portable through more extensive disassembly but is primarily intended as permanent. It may be constructed on- or off-site then anchored and connected to utilities as permanent.
- Theme park food and merchandise carts, kiosks and mobile food dispensing vehicles are classified as mobile or stationary units that operate within the confines of a theme park or entertainment complex.

REQUIREMENTS

Note: All vendors shall adhere to the following requirements for installation and use of carts and portable structures.

1. All carts and/or portable structures shall be required to be constructed and anchored to meet the design for wind loadings as required by the EPCOT Building Code Section 904.

Exception: The Applicant shall provide a letter stating that the cart or portable structure will be removed upon warning of a hurricane.
 - (a) All Disney owned carts or portable structures will require a letter from the Vice President of the area where a cart or portable structure is installed, stating the location where the cart or portable structure will be stored for the duration of a hurricane.
 - (b) All other vendor owned carts or portable structures will require a letter from the owner stating that the cart or portable structure will be removed from Reedy Creek Improvement District's (the District) jurisdiction upon warning of a hurricane and the means of removal.
2. A backflow preventer shall be installed for all potable water hose connections or connections that are hard piped.
