

PROJECT MANAGEMENT PERMITS AND OUT-OF-STATE CONTRACTORS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Why do I need to pull a permit if I am not doing any physical work at Disney?

A: A Project Management permit is required when the property owner contracts a firm/individual to deliver a project even though the firm or individual will not physically perform any work other than construction management. (See Building Permit Application Requirements for additional info.)

Q: Is there a fee for the Project Management permit?

A: Yes. A permit fee is required, based on the current Fee Schedule. (Note: No plan review fee will be assessed as part of the fees for a Project Management permit.)

Q: Are drawings required for the Project Management permit?

A: No. A licensed contractor shall submit a sub permit and include all required submittals for that permit, including drawings.

Q: Is a Notice of Commencement (NOC) needed for a Project Management permit?

A: Yes. An NOC is required to be applied with the appropriate county for any work over \$2,500. The Project Management firm/individual will be the contractor on record on the application. RCID Building & Safety requires a county-stamped recorded copy of the NOC with the permit application. (Note: The permit application, contract and NOC must all list the same firm/individual contractor name.)

Q: How do I apply for a Project Management permit?

A: Once registered with RCID Building & Safety, all permits are applied via the online permitting system, Accela Citizen Access (ACA), at: <https://ca.rcid.org/citizenaccess>.

Q: I do not have an office in Florida. What do I need to apply for a permit with RCID Building & Safety?

A: In order to apply for a permit with RCID Building & Safety, you must register by providing a copy of your Florida State License, County Business Tax Receipt and Workman's Comp. (If you do not have a Florida License, see State of Florida Foreign Corporation certificate below.) All documents can be sent to the general email account with a note that you would like to register for permitting at: RCIDPermits@rcid.org. If you do not have a State License, be sure to note on the email.

To obtain an Osceola County Business Tax Receipt, call the main Osceola County Tax Collector office at: (407) 742-4000, or visit their website at: www.osceolataxcollector.com.

(Note for both counties: describe the work that is being done onsite within RCID and that you are required to have a local county Business Tax Receipt to pull permits w/RCID Building & Safety. Be sure to include the Disney work site address for the business location.)

In order to obtain a county Business Tax Receipt, you will be required to provide proof of a State of Florida Foreign Corporation validation by the county where you file for a Business Tax Receipt. More information can be found by calling: (850) 245-6051 or <http://www.sunbiz.org/index.html>. This certificate is required when non-licensed entities do business in the State of Florida.
